



## IMPORTANT DATES

- **Friday, March 26, 12:00 p.m.**      **Deadline for sale of Chametz**
- **Sunday, March 28, after 8:01 p.m.**      **Search for Chametz in your home, car and office (for details, see Artscroll Siddur p. 654)**
- **Monday, March 29, 7:30 a.m.**      **Morning service followed by Siyum for Fast of the Firstborn (men and women welcome)**
- **Monday March 29 10:44 a.m.**      **Latest time to eat and remove Chametz (and to recite the paragraph following burning of the Chametz, Arscroll Siddur p. 654)**
- **Monday March 29 8:02 p.m.**      **First Seder. (The Seder should not begin prior to this time.) Remember to light a Yahrzeit candle before lighting the Yom Tov candles so you can use the flame for the second night lighting.**
- **Tuesday, March 30, 8:03 p.m.**      **Second Seder (The Seder and preparations should not begin earlier than this time)**
- **Sunday, April 4, 7:17 p.m.**      **Remember to light a Yahrzeit candle before lighting the Yom Tov candles so you can use the flame for the second night lighting**
- **Monday, April 5, 8:09 p.m. or after**      **When lighting Yom Tov candles, light Yahrzeit candles as well, for any of your 7 close relatives: parents, spouse, siblings or children. (Use the candle you lit the previous night.)**
- **Tuesday, April 6, 9:18 p.m.**      **Re-acquire Chametz (Pesach dishes can be put away from the time the holiday ends, but Chametz should not be consumed for one hour, which is 9:18 p.m.)**
